Dear Families,

During the next two months, you will notice some technological changes in our schools.

More specifically for each age group, you will see the following additions:

**Grades K-3:** New Mac lab on second floor

**Grades 4-5:** A laptop cart will be available to roll into the classrooms for more integration into the curriculum

**Grades 6-7-8:** A laptop cart will be available for classroom integration

**Grades 9-12:** All students received their laptops last week.

Students will bring laptops to each class

and the textbook will not be the only resource.

This enhancement enables curriculum to go beyond the four walls of the classroom.

As these changes come about for our school, we have to keep in mind what Pope Benedict said about technology.

Pope Benedict has talked about giving a "soul to technology." He has used technology to reach out to young people and to Catholics who are homebound.

We, as a Catholic school, are uniquely qualified to connect faith, technology, and learning.

As we integrate more technology into our schools, it is important to teach appropriate and inappropriate use of this powerful tool for education. For this reason, "netiquette" is at the top on our list of priorities to teach to our students.

### **Faith Beyond Religion Class...**

Sharpeners buzzing, lockers slamming, laughter resounding, reading together, solving math problems, practicing those cursive letters...voices lifting in prayer. All of these sounds are heard echoing through our classrooms, hallways, on the playground, and in the church. All according to schedules worked out this past summer: a starting point and an ending point for every subject. Except for one. We call it religion class. Yes, there is a time set aside every day to focus on "religion" and a book to guide us in learning the laws of the Church we are to follow. However, there's something a bit different about this particular class. It is a never-ending class! It has no beginning and no end.

I guess it depends on whether one is thinking religion class or learning about our faith. One complements the other, but the premise of integrating faith into the lives of everyone we touch is so very important to the identity of our Pacelli Catholic Schools. One of the goals of a Catholic school is to weave the Catholic identity into each and every academic class offered. Learning about faith does not take place for only 45 minutes a day; this learning permeates the whole day in every class every student participates in, every school activity that is joined, every interaction that takes place.

An article found in the Today's Catholic Teacher titled "What Makes the Catholic School Catholic?", states that "Learning in the Catholic school is a means to bring students to Christ and empower them to bring Christ to others. It is not an end in itself. This is the fundamental difference between Catholic schools and public schools." This statement and, for that matter, the whole article struck me like a flash of lightning (sort of like St. Paul :). But, to get serious again, we are all here to show Christ to others in what we say, do, and in how we act. Faith integration is ongoing, not just "a class with a book".

Maybe that's why religion books never seem to get completed through to the very last chapter. So much more is going on within the walls of our Pacelli community; some of that spills out into the community, nation, and even the world. The teachers and students of the Pacelli community are **striving daily** (sometimes successfully, other times, not) to bring Christ to others through prayer, POWER, Feed My Starving Children, classroom service projects, Advent activities (advent wreath, rosary), Christmas Basket project, Lenten activities (stations, Living Stations, special prayers), Easter celebrations, and the preparations for the beautiful and holy sacraments being received during the school year. It seems these activities, and others I'm sure I have not mentioned, follow the Liturgical calendar of the Church year. What a wonderful journey this is, not just for our Pacelli community, but for all faith-filled Christians who are just trying to bring Christ to others in many ways other than just reading a book.

I have made this journey with many classes over the 37 years that I have taught in Catholic school. Now that my part in the Pacelli Community has changed, I am looking forward to exploring new ways to bring Christ to others and to watch with awe just what the teachers and staff, the students, and all associated with this holy place bring to the journey. **WE ARE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER!** We thank those in the community for their support and continued prayers on this continuous journey. ## DEVELOPMENT NEWS...

### Grant

The Pacelli Catholic Schools received a generous grant from the United Way of Mower County Get Fit Challenge to upgrade our Physical Education equipment. The equipment will benefit our students by encouraging them to be healthy, active and physically fit. The equipment will also provide our Physical Education teachers a better means of teaching, offering a larger variety of exercise equipment to be utilized in sports and games played during classes.. Some of the equipment included in the upgrade are basketballs, dodgeballs, a volleyball net, and a tumbling mat. We are in the process of purchasing the new equipment so that it can be incorporated into our classes for the 2010-2011 school year.

### Walkathon

Please join us for our annual Walkathon on Friday, October 8 (if it rains, the walk will be rescheduled for Friday, October 15). This year's theme is "The Dash for Trash". Students, staff and participants will be taking part in a service project for the community of Austin by picking up trash during our Walkathon. The Walkathon is a very important fundraiser for our school. Last year we raised over \$27,000, and we have set a goal of raising \$30,000 this year! The money is valuable to help provide the best Catholic education possible.

Please bring or send the items to school with your child on Friday morning, Oct. 8, no later than 10 am. (Please use paper boxes, plates, etc., to eliminate lost plates and pans.)

### SCRIP

Please remember to use SCRIP. It is a very profitable program, even though we have very few regular SCRIP users who are school families. Last year we made over \$30,000 in net profit from our SCRIP sales! If all of our school families used SCRIP regularly, we would profit at least twice that amount, which would mean possible elimination of other fundraisers that we currently have! Remember that each time you purchase SCRIP, you earn 2% as tuition credit. Family and friends can designate your family to receive the credit from their SCRIP purchases as well. Two percent may not seem like a lot, but it adds up very quickly. For example, if you spend \$150 on gas and groceries each week, that's \$3 off your tuition each week, for a total of \$156 each year! Wouldn't you like to receive \$156 back?! You would also be raising about that same amount for the school! We also allow families who intend to enroll in Pacelli to bank SCRIP for future K-12 tuition. This is credit that will be put towards your tuition to offset the expense of that first year in school.

Anyone can also help a family bank SCRIP by purchasing SCRIP and designating a future Pacelli student to receive the tuition credit.

On September 17 the kindergarten class learned about the importance of handwashing in stopping the spread of germs. We discussed how germs get on your hands and can make you sick. GloGerm powder (pretend germs) was sprinkled on each student's hands before they practiced their handwashing. When they finished washing, a black light revealed how many pretend germs were still on their hands. What a surprise for the kindergartners when they saw all those pretend germs they thought they had washed away. Handwashing is the first line of defense against germs and can help protect you against colds, flu and other illnesses. Could you pass the black light test?

### **How to Stay Healthy this School Year**

**WASH YOUR HANDS!** Proper handwashing is the easiest and cheapest way to prevent the spread of flu and other illnesses. To protect yourself, remember to:

- Wash your hands before eating, after using the restroom and anytime they look, feel or smell dirty.
- Cough or sneeze into your elbow, not into your hands.
- Keep your fingers out of your eyes, nose or mouth. The eyes, nose and mouth are the portals of entry for all respiratory and gastrointestinal diseases.

**Higher Ed Opportunities at Pacelli** submitted by Guidance Counselor, Laura Sheedy  
We as a Pacelli family are thrilled to bring a new opportunity to our upperclassmen. This 2010-2011 school year will have a college credit class offered in the Pacelli Building through Saint Mary's University in Winona, Minnesota. The opportunity comes through the Program for Advanced College Credit (PACC). This class will have the same expectations, workload, learning activities, projects and exams that students at Saint Mary's would expect as first year college students. As established by Saint Mary's students must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or above. The PACC program only offers classes to students at private high schools, including Cotter High School in Winona and seven other schools in Minnesota.

**What does this mean for you as students and parents?**

- Assessment takes place throughout the class, students earn one grade for the semester class. Dual enrollment credit (earn both high school and college credit at the same time)
- Additional scholarship money is available to students who succeed in this class who eventually go to Saint Mary's as full time freshmen.
- **This opportunity does come at an additional fee of \$60 per credit (\$180 total) for this class. The check goes directly to Saint Mary's.**

The three credit class that we will offer this school year will be PS102 American National Government. This is a three credit college class that will cover the "nature and purpose of our U.S. political system; includes the Constitution, institutions, processes and persons that combine to form our federal government. The student is exposed to a variety of approaches to political study."

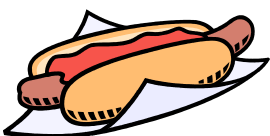

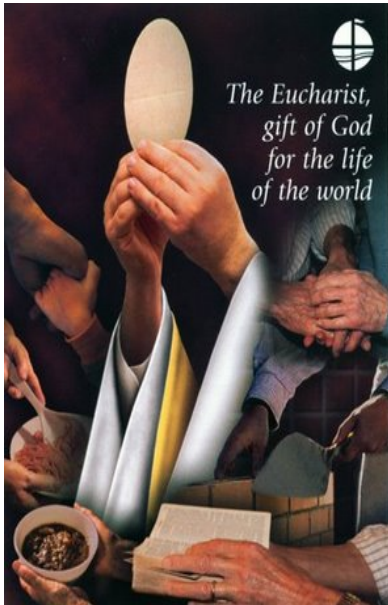

- “Catholic Corner” faith information sheets

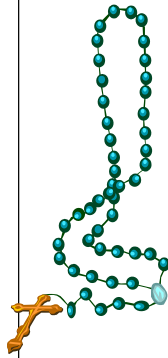
We have begun planning projects for this year and would like input from families. What type of programs, activities, or events would interest you and enrich your faith life?

## **ANNUAL NOTIFICATION OF ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT ACTIVITIES**

September 20, 2010

During the past school year and continuing into the 2010-2011 school year, the following asbestos management activities have been or are currently being completed. These activities are pursuant to the Environmental Protection Agency 40 CFR 763 "Asbestos Containing Materials, Final Rule and Notice."

- Two (2) Semi-Annual Periodic Surveillance Inspections were completed on February 15, 2010 and August 6, 2010.
- Asbestos repairs
- Asbestos floor tile and pipe wrap
- Asbestos insulation removal
- Notification of Asbestos locations for short term workers (electricians, plumbers, etc.)
- Training of school district personnel

During the 2009-2010 school year and the beginning of the 2010-2011 school year, the Pacelli Catholic Schools had five (5) response actions i.e., asbestos abatement, repairs, enclosure or encapsulation projects.

1. Removal of asbestos insulation on the boiler, steam and water pipes in the boiler room and pump room by the boiler room in the high school.
2. Removal of loose floor tile in the library in the elementary school
3. Removal of loose floor tile in the hallway on the second floor of the high school, West side
4. Patch and repair various areas of damaged preformed pipe in the high school.
5. Patch and repair various areas of damaged preformed pipe in the elementary school

The Pacelli Catholic Schools are planning no (0) abatement projects for the 2010-2011 school year.

The Pacelli Catholic Schools are contracted through the Southeast Service Cooperative with the Institute for Environmental Assessment to provide environmental consulting services.
